
### Notes from the Manse

"But speaking the truth in love, we must grow up in every way into him who is the head into Christ,/ from whom the whole body, joined and knit together by every ligament with which it is equipped, as each part is working properly, promotes the body's growth in building itself up in love."—Ephesians 4:15,16

Back when I was a teacher, in order to encourage kids to write, write without worry about grades or whether everything was perfect, I had my students keep journals. The agreement was simple—they could write whatever they wanted, reflections on life or just their day, as long as they wrote something, even a little, every day. For my part, I would simply check to see that they were writing. Anything they did not want me to read they would mark with an asterisk; if they wanted to have me read their stuff, they could let me know. Well, strange to say, most kids did want me to read their journals. Many were struggling, with family or friends or just adolescence, and they seemed to like having someone to confide in, someone who would, in effect, listen, without they're having actually to say a thing. In time, some of those kids would seek me out and we would have the conversations begun in those journals.

Around the same time, I was charged with bringing back to life the school's community service program. The founder of the school had believed deeply in the place serving others had in a child's education, but over the years, the program had kind of died. So, I contacted nursing homes and day care centers and a local facility for the mentally handicapped to find volunteer work for high school students. To the surprise of many of the adults at the school, the program took off like wildfire, with more and more kids getting involved every year. But the first to get involved were for the most part drawn from those students who had opened their often troubled hearts to me in those journals. And the wonderful thing is the service work they did seemed to open up their lives, show them possibility where they had thought they had none, give them an awakening sense of hope, of a future for them. Later, other, different kinds of students joined the program. Service work became kind of cool, even for the star athletes.

It is January, a month that for many is a time for new beginnings, for resolutions, rarely kept, but reflecting a desire to grow, to change. I begin this year with a commitment to change many things, to grow, I hope, in many ways. And it is good that Leacock, like any church, also grow into the future. But as we do, let us remember whom it is we are to grow into—Jesus Christ, who is the head of the church, who is the way, the way all of us should live. And how will we grow? Well, Jesus showed us that too. We are to grow, we are to build ourselves up in love, with love, through love. It was in service to others, it was in caring for, loving others that those students grew and changed, began to discover and realize who they could be. So, let us enter the new year daring new beginnings. If we do so with love, if we seek first to help each other, we will grow ever more into our Lord. We will become new creations.
