Notes from the Manse

"Let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, since as members of one body your were called to peace.

And be thankful." Colossians 3:15

That second sentence above—it is so simple, and yet, sometimes, it can be so hard. People drive us crazy; worse they hurt us. Trouble comes into our lives and we are confused; we are afraid. Or we are alone, or at least feel so, so alone. In times such as these, the whole idea of being thankful may be the last thing that comes to our minds. But if you go to *Colossians* and read from 3:12 to 17, three times we are told to be grateful, to speak our thanks. And it isn't just there. I went back and looked at my *Notes from the Manse* over the last several years and saw that I had written about the need to be thankful at least four times and in doing so I quoted several different passages of Scripture. In our relationship with God, in our relationship with each other, there just seems to be something so important about being thankful and showing gratitude.

And I am grateful. I am grateful for many things, one of which is this church and its people. Last month, in the midst of all the usual holiday rush, Emily and I got sick, but still there was no time to stop. Just when I began to feel a bit weary, we started to receive kind words from you, so many of you, sometimes when someone stopped me after a service or in the hall when I was working in the office, other times in a card or an e-mail. There were gifts, too, including some from my Secret Santa; and there was the generous gift from the congregation as a whole. What mattered in all of this was the kindness, the taking the time to say, in one way or the other, thank you. And so now it is my turn to say to you thank you, thank you so much.

Still, it was, in many ways, a tough year. There was sickness, some of which goes on. And there was loss, as always too much loss. As a fellowship, we had to say goodbye to Warren Brackbill, Ella Clark, Doc Denlinger, Clair Hamilton, and Malcolm Stannard. And Emily and I lost her father, Wukka Michie. Yet, in the midst of the sorrow, there were moments of grace and laughter. In my visits to the hospital, I seemed sometimes to confuse the hospital folks. Once, two nurses hurried up to me and asked which practice I was from; it was tempting to look serious and say I was from some doctor's office. Another time, I was sitting with June and Malcolm when two folks came in to discuss things, and the woman in charge identified me as June's son. Well, that just delighted June and me, and ever since, she and I will on occasion call each other mom or son.

And really that isn't so crazy. On the cross, knowing Mary would be alone, Jesus looked at his mother and pointing to the beloved disciple said, "Woman, behold your son." And he told the disciple that here was his mother. Throughout his ministry, Jesus urges us again and again to re-imagine our conception of family, to extend it beyond mere blood relations so that we love and care for all our sisters and brothers. If we did, if we really lived as if we were members of one body as the quote from *Colossians* tells us, then we would more fully know the peace to which we are called. We would know the peace of Christ. We would never be alone, no matter what. What a reason to be thankful!

I am so excited to report on November and December's financial numbers! At the end of October, we were behind \$5,756 in offering to actual money spent up to that point. It looked much better than the last two years, but still pretty bleak being at a nearly 6,000 dollar deficit. The generous people of Leacock made November and December two of the best months we have seen this year for offering, and

actually wiped out that deficit. IN FACT, we had \$911.03 more in offering than what was spent for the year. That is a HUGE positive event for us, after several years of thousands of dollars in deficit at the end of the years. Thank you, thank you, thank you Leacock Presbyterian Church. Just to put in perspective how wonderful this really is, let's look back at the last few years:

2011 (\$10,674.34) deficit (had to spend this much more than what was received in offering)

2012 (\$9,019.01) deficit (had to spend this much more than what was received in offering)

2013 (\$17,656.06) deficit (had to spend this much more than what was received in offering)

2014 \$911.03 OVER EXPENSES (received more than what had to be spent)

2015 \$ Who knows what good we can do!!

A whopping \$37,425.59 was given to Benevolence from our offering this year! Although if we hit the budget, \$40,900 would have gone to the Mission Committee to use to help others in our local area, state, country and even internationally.

I don't want to be negative, but I do need to report on how we did against the budget, which is what we thought we would get in offering. The budget was \$226,889, we received \$207,574 in offering, so we were behind \$19,315 in comparison to our 2014 plan. The last two years have seen a major effort to bring the budget into closer alignment with what we actually receive in offering. That has been a heart-wrenching task, as Benevolence bears a lot of the cuts. Our fixed expenses to keep a minister and employees, keep the buildings maintained, heat and cool the buildings etc... has also been examined and changes made. We are looking at changes that may save only I or 2 hundred dollars a year, which when compared to how far we are off budget is a drop in the bucket; HOWEVER, every bit counts and a little more will go to benevolence. We are working ever closer to a realistic budget plan that will match what we receive in offering. The Session and Trustees can only do so much planning and being good stewards. You, the congregation and friends of Leacock as a whole, as a community in Christ are what makes things happen! And you did a great job this year. Thank you all again.




Gratitude Corner (Those Who Go Above and Beyond to Care for their Minister and His Wife)
