The total giving for the month of March was excellent. In addition to the regular offering of \$14,773, approximately \$7,000 was given to the Trustee Special Fund which was used to replace the manse furnace and \$177 was collected at the Easter breakfast. Offerings large and small add up and help the ministry of Leacock to happen, within our own four walls or beyond.

Ministry beyond our walls happens through our designated mission items included within our annual budget and our Per Capita giving - in March around \$3,000 was earmarked for Per Capita.

Shared Proportional Giving (Per Capita) is how Presbyterians mutually share the costs of ministry. Our giving helps support the work of our executive Presbyter, Erin Cox-Holmes who visits and works with all the sessions and pastors of the Donegal Presbytery, praying and supporting our churches in times of growth and/or crisis. Our participation, along with that of all the other churches in Donegal, helps fund operations of Presbytery including: lights, heat, communication systems, and business administration. Also, Presbytery has "our back." Erin Cox-Holmes will be leading our worship and retreat on May 22 encouraging our Leacock family's journey of faith.

If you haven't contributed yet to the 2016 Shared Proportional Giving, please prayerfully consider giving the \$32.27 per member set for this year - use the envelope in your box or a plain envelope marked "Per Capita." Thank you.

Looking ahead! Summer's coming, ministry continues through those months even though our giving tends to decrease. We may be on vacation, and grateful for the opportunity, but Leacock is never on vacation. Remember to continue your weekly offering even though you may be enjoying a relaxing time elsewhere!
