

At times our types of giving have been described as first mile giving and second mile giving. First mile is a term used in relation to the weekly offerings given in response to or support of the annual budget which is voted on every November as our monetary guideline for the next calendar year. Second mile gifts are usually offerings over and above the one we have declared support for (the annual budget.) What does not show up in the above numbers is Leacock's second mile giving. Year to date we have given an extra \$5000 in benevolence funds from such special offerings as Blanket, OGHS, Souper Bowl, Donegal 2016, and "Missions."

The Trustee Special Offering has received over \$4500 in June, July and August alone.

As we enter the last quarter of the year our giving continues generously, yet our budgeted giving has us shy of our budgeted spending to date. May we all in the weeks ahead prayerfully consider the monetary offerings we bring to worship, both our first and our second mile giving.





Just a reminder that the community meal for October is on Thursday, October 27th from 5:30-6:30 in our Smith Fellowship Hall. Everyone is welcome whether you come to help prepare and serve or just come to eat and fellowship with people in the Paradise community and our church family. Looking forward to seeing you there! Also a note for the future: Please mark your calendars. The November meal will be held the 2nd Thursday, Nov. 10th because of Thanksgiving on the fourth Thursday.

The first Sunday in October, the 2nd, is a special offering Sunday as well as Worldwide Communion. This is the Sunday that we take the Peacemaking Offering. However the name has now been changed to the Peace and Global Witness Offering. It was felt that this "new" offering would have a greater global reach, more significant impact, and bring peace to people through Christ. A gift to this offering enables the church to promote the peace of Christ by addressing systems of injustice across the world. Congregations are encouraged to utilize up to 25% of this offering to connect with the global witness of Christ's peace. Mid councils retain an additional 25% for ministries of peace and reconciliation. The other 50% is used by the Presbyterian mission agency to advocate for peace and justice in cultures of violence, including our own, through collaborative projects of education and Christian witness. The envelopes will be in the pews on the designated Sunday. Please place them in the offering plate. Give as you feel led by the Holy Spirit.

The annual CROP Walk to raise money to feed the hungry will be held Sunday, October 16th, rain or shine. This will be our 35th walk for hunger, and we need everyone's support to make this year's walk an even bigger success than last year's. We need walkers, sponsors, and people to drive around and check on the walkers. There is a choice of a 3 mile or 5 mile course. And we have even talked about trying to make a 1 mile course (you know, for those of us who are getting along in years!). Get a group together and use this "walking time" to fellowship with other walkers or church members.. There is no rush in completing this walk.. Simply enjoy being together and God's creation! Registration begins at 1:00 in our church narthex. The walk begins at 1:30. Remember that 25% of all money raised by us will remain in the Paradise area and will be donated to the Paradise area food bank.
