Also, our **Advent Study** continues following worship. We will meet together to learn about and reflect on scriptural understandings of time and the proclamations surrounding them.


The forms to order **Poinsettia plants** are in the Narthex. Please complete the form along with your payment to the church office by next Sunday, December 11.
