### \*Call to Worship

Leader: We gather today to remember and proclaim that we are God's people.

People: We are God's people! God's presence is among us!

Leader: Like Moses, we seek an encounter with God's goodness.

People: God, show us your goodness that we may glorify you in all that we do.

Leader: God's goodness passes by us every day in the gracious gifts of creation and in the faces of our neighbors.

People: God, help us notice your goodness in everything and everyone that we meet.

Leader: Because of God's goodness, we join the voice of the psalmist who proclaimed:

People: O sing to the LORD a new song; sing to the LORD, all the earth.

Leader: Sing to the LORD, bless God's name; tell of God's salvation from day to day.

People: We will declare God's glory among the nations, God's marvelous works among all the peoples.

Leader: For great is the LORD who made the heavens, and greatly to be praised; our God is to be revered above all gods.

People: Honor and majesty are before our God; strength and beauty are in God's sanctuary.

Leader: Ascribe to the LORD, O families of the peoples, ascribe to the LORD glory and strength. Ascribe to the LORD the glory due God's name.

People: Therefore, we will worship the LORD in holy splendor; for the LORD will judge the peoples with equity and with truth.

Often enough we do not recognize your holy touch in the world around us, and neglect our responsibility to treat all things and all people as sacred. Forgive us, we pray, and free us to live in love and peace with you, with ourselves, with our neighbors, and with all creation. AMEN


