

**Today's well-known first hymn: "Holy, Holy, Holy" appears in over 1,637 hymnals. The author Reginald Heber was born in 1783 into a wealthy, educated family. At 17 he entered Oxford, winning awards for his poetry, and upon graduation became rector of his father's church near Shrewsbury, 150 miles NW of London. In 1823 he was appointed Bishop of Calcutta where he worked tirelessly for three years until extreme weather and travel took its toll. He died of a stroke in 1826 at the age of 43. Most of his 57 hymns are still in use today.
